NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that a Protest Hearing will be held by the Executive Officer of Tulare County LAFCO. The hearing will be held at Administrative Building Supervisors Chambers, County Civic Center, 2800 W. Burrell Avenue, Visalia, on **October 9th, 2024, at 2:00 P.M.**, to hear and receive any oral or written protests, objections, or evidence which are made, presented, or filed regarding the following proposal: LAFCO Case# **1585 CONSOLIDATION WATER DISTRICT (CWD) Formation.**

The landowner petition was filed with the Executive Officer of the Tulare County Local Agency Formation Commission. The formation of the proposed Consolidated Water District is to serve approximately 80,000 acres located within Tulare County roughly bounded by the Kaweah River to the North, Road 196 to the East, The Tule River to the South, and the Cities of Visalia, and Tulare on the West. The proposed Water District is intended to support the Ag industry through management of water resources in the area.

The Tulare County LAFCO approved the proposal on September 4, 2024. The proposed terms and conditions for this formation are set forth in LAFCO Resolution No.24-015 which is available for review at the **Tulare County Local Agency Formation Commission, 210 N. Church Street Suite B, Visalia, CA.** Written protests must comply with Government Code §57051. Any registered voter residing within and anyone owning land within the territory proposed to be included in the formation may file a written protest. Such protest must be submitted to the LAFCo address listed above prior to the conclusion of the hearing. The written protest must include your name, address, LAFCO case number and date.
