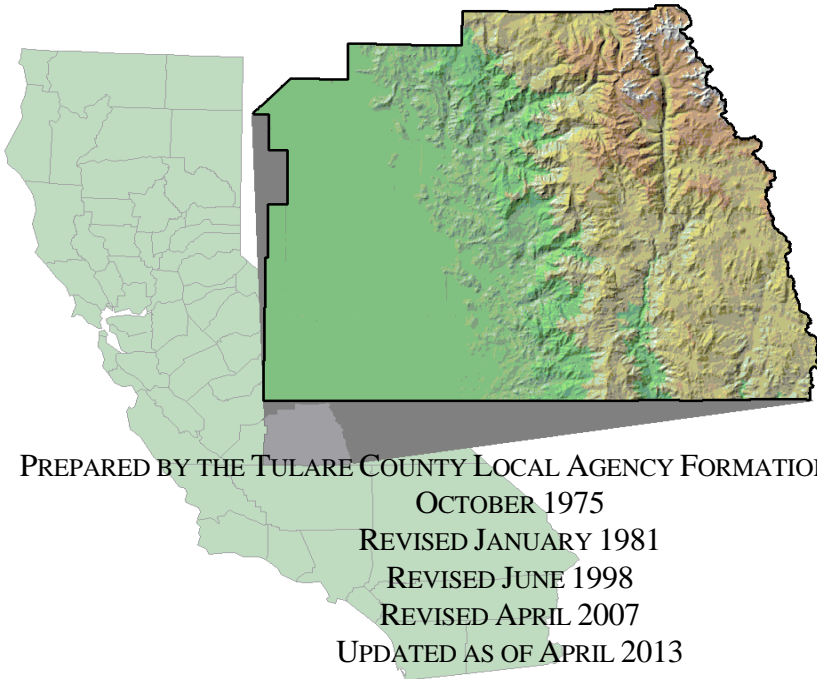

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INTRODUCTION



What is LAFCO?

The Tulare County Local Agency Formation Commission (LAFCO) is responsible for coordinating logical and timely changes in local governmental boundaries, for conducting special studies which review ways to reorganize, simplify, and streamline governmental structure, and for preparing Spheres of Influence for each city and special district within Tulare County. The Commission's efforts are directed to seeing that services are provided efficiently and economically while agricultural and open-space lands are protected. LAFCO is independent of the government of Tulare County or any of the cities. However, funding to operate the agency is required to be provided by the County and incorporated cities.

The Commission is composed of two county supervisors selected by the Board of Supervisors, two city council representatives selected by the City Selection Committee, and one public member selected by the other four members. Commission members serve four-year terms. There is an alternate member for each category - city, county, and public. Tulare County LAFCO does not have special district members. However, the law does provide for the addition of two special district members and one alternate special district member if the Commission so orders or the special districts petition for such a representation. With membership, the special districts would also be required to help fund the agency.

The Tulare County LAFCO is responsible for coordinating logical and timely changes in local governmental boundaries, conducting special studies which review ways to reorganize, simplify, and streamline governmental structure and preparing Spheres of Influence for each city and special district within the County. The Commission's efforts are directed to seeing that services are provided efficiently and economically while agricultural and open-space lands are protected.

History

The end of World War II saw California experiencing a tremendous population increase which resulted in the sporadic formation of cities and special service districts.

The results of this land speculation and development boom became evident as more of California's agricultural land was converted to urban uses. Premature and unplanned development created inefficient, expensive systems of delivering public services using various small units of local government.

Governor Edmund G. Brown, Sr. responded to this problem in 1959 by appointing the Commission on Metropolitan Area Problems. The Commission's charge was to study and make recommendations on the "misuse of land resources" and the growing complexity of overlapping local governmental jurisdictions. The Commission's recommendations on local governmental reorganization (the Knox-Nisbet Act) were introduced in the Legislature in 1963 resulting in the creation of Local Agency Formation Commissions, or "LAFCOs", operating in each county except San Francisco. The Knox-Nisbet Act of 1963 was consolidated with other various bills and amendments under the Cortese-Knox Local Government Reorganization Act of 1985. This act was comprehensively revised by the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Local Government Reorganization Act of 2000 (California Government Code §56000 et.seq.).

Objectives of LAFCO

- To encourage the orderly formation of local governmental agencies:

LAFCOs review proposals for the formation of new local governmental agencies and changes of organization in existing agencies. In California, there are 57 LAFCOs working with over 5,500 governmental agencies in 57 counties, 500+ cities, and 5,000+ special districts. Agency boundaries are often unrelated to one another and sometimes overlap at random. This complexity of local government can lead to higher service costs to the taxpayer and general confusion with regard to service jurisdictions. LAFCO decisions strive to balance the competing needs in California for affordable housing, economic opportunity, and conservation of natural resources.

- To preserve agricultural land resources:

LAFCO must consider the effect that any proposal will produce on existing agricultural lands. By guiding development towards vacant urban land and away from agricultural preserves, LAFCO assists with the preservation of our valuable agricultural resources

- To discourage urban sprawl:

Urban sprawl can best be described as irregular and disorganized growth occurring without apparent design or plan. This pattern of development is characterized by the inefficient delivery of important urban services (police, fire, water, and sanitation) and the unnecessary loss of agricultural land. By discouraging sprawl, LAFCO discourages the misuse of land resources and promotes a more efficient system of local governmental agencies.

Types of LAFCO Proposals

The following is a list of the types of changes of organization that are heard by LAFCO. Any city, county, or special district may initiate (request LAFCO to consider) any of these proposals through the process described in the Cortese-Knox-Hertzberg Act. Additionally, the Act allows registered voters or property owners who can provide the required number of signatures to petition LAFCO to consider any of these projects.

Annexation - the annexation, inclusion, attachment, or addition of territory to a city or special district.

Consolidation - the uniting or joining of two or more cities located in the same county into a single new successor city, or two or more special districts into a single new successor district. In the case of consolidation of special districts, all those districts shall have been formed pursuant to the same principle act (meaning they must be the same type of special district.)

Detachment- the detachment, deannexation, exclusion, deletion, or removal from a city or special district of any portion of the territory of that city or special district.

Disincorporation - the disincorporation, dissolution, extinguishment, and termination of the existence of a city and the cessation of its corporate powers, except for the purpose of winding up the affairs of the city.

Dissolution - the dissolution, disincorporation, extinguishment, and termination of the existence of a special district and the cessation of all its corporate powers, except for the purpose of winding up the affairs of the district.

Formation - the formation, incorporation, organization, or creation of a special district.

Establishment of Subsidiary District - the formation or creation of a special district of limited powers in which a city council is designated as, and is empowered to act as, the ex officio board of directors of the district.

Incorporation - the incorporation, formation, creation, and establishment of a city with corporate powers. Any area proposed for incorporation as a new city shall have at least 500 registered voters residing within the affected area at the time commission proceedings are initiated.

Merger - the extinguishment, termination, and cessation of the existence of a special district of limited powers by the merger of that district with a city.

Provision of Service Agreement - an agreement between a local agency and a property owner whereby new or extended services may be provided to property outside the boundaries of a local agency but inside the sphere of influence. This is not a change of organization because no boundary lines are changed.

Reorganization - two or more changes of organization initiated in a single proposal.

Any of the above proposals may be initiated by a city, the county or a special district. LAFCO does have the authority to initiate proceedings for some types of proposals on its own. These include proposals for consolidation of special districts, dissolution, merger, establishment of a subsidiary district, or a reorganization that includes any of these changes of organization. LAFCO does not have the authority to initiate proceedings for an annexation, detachment, disincorporation, formation, or incorporation. Prior to the initiation of a project by LAFCO, a study which contains recommendations or conclusions that are consistent with such a change of organization must be prepared.

Spheres of Influence

At its meeting on January 5, 1972, Tulare County LAFCO determined that it would establish spheres of influence for those types of special service districts and municipalities which often propose boundary changes. As defined in the State Government Code, a sphere of influence is a plan for probable physical boundaries and service areas of local governmental agencies.

On March 4, 1972, it became mandatory under State law that spheres of influence be established and be used as a basis for decisions on all proposals within LAFCO jurisdiction. The law was amended by the legislature in 1973; it provided that spheres of influence would be used by LAFCO as a factor in making decisions on proposals over which they have jurisdiction.

In order to establish boundary lines under the spheres of influence concept, the State has required that LAFCO consider and prepare a written statement of its determinations with respect to each of the following:

1. The present and planned land uses in the area, including agricultural and open-space lands.

2. The present and probable need for public facilities and services of the area.
3. The present capacity of public facilities and adequacy of public services that the agency provides or is authorized to provide.
4. The existence of any social or economic communities of interest in the area if the commission determines that they are relevant to the agency.

Using the criteria provided by enabling legislation, as those criteria have been amended from time to time, Tulare County LAFCO has adopted spheres of influence lines for all eight cities and for the majority of the special districts within the county, excluding districts which are not under LAFCO's jurisdiction, such as school districts, assessment districts, and air pollution districts.

On February 6, 1996, Tulare County LAFCO adopted a policy for the location and amendment of the spheres of influence of the eight cities and of those special districts which provide urban services in established communities. That policy states that the sphere of influence should be based on the twenty-year growth area of the community. The full text of the policy is found in Policy C-5 of the [Tulare LAFCO Policy and Procedure Manual](#).

The requirement of the completion of Municipal Service Reviews (MSRs) before Spheres could be updated was added as part of the CKH legislation in 2000. As part of the MSRs, the Commission is required to adopt a written statement of determinations for the following areas:

1. Infrastructure needs or deficiencies.
2. Growth and population projections for the affected area.
3. Financing constraints and opportunities.
4. Cost avoidance opportunities.
5. Opportunities for rate restructuring.
6. Opportunities for shared facilities.
7. Government structure options, including advantages and disadvantages of consolidation or reorganization of service providers.
8. Evaluation of management efficiencies.
9. Local accountability and governance.

Inventory Contents

This publication is an inventory and compilation of all of the cities and all of the types of special districts in Tulare County which fall under LAFCO jurisdiction. The inventory contains the following information for LAFCO districts:

Legal Powers

The powers and functions which may be exercised and performed by a particular type of local agency are provided for by the statute under which the agency was formed. The authorized powers and functions of any local agency, however, are often broader than those actually exercised by the agency.

Each special district has certain general powers which are substantially common to all. For example, the power to sue and be sued; the right of perpetual succession; the power to engage in and pay for work in the performance of the affairs of the agency; and the right to acquire, operate, and dispose of real and personal property. The general powers of a district are therefore not specifically defined in this document. In order to determine the general powers of a specific type of district, reference should be made to the statute under which each was formed.

In addition to its general powers, each type of special district has specific powers granted to it. These powers have been included in this document in quasi-specific terms; they are not intended to be a technical or legal analysis. For a more detailed analysis, reference should be made to the specific statute provisions for each district.

Contact Information

The mailing address, physical address (when different), phone number and contact person for each city and special district are listed. Also included, where available, are the fax number, contact e-mail address and website.

Functions Performed

The activities that a district or agency is empowered to do and those activities actually carried out are often quite different. A district can be legally authorized to perform numerous distinct functions, but as a matter of practice performs only a few of those authorized functions. The performance inventory lists the functions which are actually performed by each district. Because the activities performed by the cities are much broader in scope, please contact each city for specific information.

Method of Financing

The methods that each special district uses to finance its activities are included in this inventory.

Please note that several changes to State law and the California Constitution have taken place since the first edition of this inventory was published. An effort has been made to keep the information current but it is generalized; the individual cities or districts should be contacted for more specific information.

Council/Board of Directors

City Councils and District Board of Directors are listed with their current term of office. Board of Director composition is subject to fairly frequent change which may not be reflected in this inventory. For the most current information, contact the specific district or for appointed Boards, the principal county's Board of Supervisors or for elected Boards, the principal county's Elections division.

City/District Statistics

Various information such as formation dates, LAFCO resolutions, agency area, SOI area and population figures are included for each district and city. The population figures for districts are based off of the most closely aligned 2000 Census Block areas. For multiple county districts, the area and population figures are for only the portion of the district within Tulare County.

Maps

Maps are included showing the present overall boundary and sphere of influence of each city and special district lying within the geographical boundaries of Tulare County which are within the jurisdiction of LAFCO. Overview maps of all the various types of special districts are also included.

Additional Included Information

Other Districts

While school districts and certain other types of districts (table grape pest control, air pollution control) do not fall under LAFCO jurisdiction, overview maps and contact information are provided.

Extinct Districts

Information and an overview map of districts that have been dissolved through dissolution, reorganization, annexation, etc. are included.

City & Urbanized District Annexation History

Statistics and maps relating to the annexation history of the cities and urbanized special districts from 1/1/1964 to 1/1/2007 are provided.

Internet Resources

A list of helpful websites is provided.

Contact Information - summary

A summarized alphabetical list of city/district contact information is provided.

Statistics - summary

A summarized alphabetical list of statistical and other pertinent information for each city/district is provided.

Cities are corporations which operate under the provisions of Government Code Sections 34000 through 45345.

Cities are governed by city councils which are elected by the residents of the city. The number of members of the city council is determined by each city.

Unlike special districts, the boundaries of a city may not extend across county boundary lines.

For information regarding function performed and method of financing, please contact the city in question directly.

There are currently eight cities within Tulare County. One city is a general law city (Farmersville) and the other seven are charter cities.

There are two cities outside of Tulare County with Spheres of Influence which extend into the County (Kingsburg and Orange Cove) and three cities with Spheres of Influence which coincide with the County boundary but do not extend into the County (Corcoran, Delano, Reedley).

CALIFORNIA WATER DISTRICTS



California Water Districts are established in accordance with the CALIFORNIA WATER DISTRICT LAW, Water Code Section 34000 et seq.

Each district is governed by a board of directors of five members elected by the voters within the district. Each director must be a holder or the legal representative of the holder of title to land within the district. By resolution of the board of directors, the number of members on the board may be increased to seven, nine or eleven.

The district is a "landowner-voter" district; a landowner has one vote for each dollar of his assessed valuation of land within the district.

In addition to its general powers a California Water District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Water Code)

- Production, storage, and distribution of water for irrigation, domestic, industrial and municipal purposes and any drainage or reclamation works incidental thereto. (§35401)
- Fix and collect charges for use of water, including standby charges. (§35470)
- Levy and collect a portion of the ad valorem rate of assessment upon each \$100 in value of land within the district. (§36608)
- Collection, treatment and disposal of sewage, waste and storm water and prescribe and collect rates or other charges for such services. (§35500)

There are currently eight California Water Districts within Tulare County with three of these being in multiple counties (Angiola, Atwell Island, Kern-Tulare). Kings is the principal county for Angiola, Kern is the principal county for Kern-Tulare and Tulare is the principal county for Atwell Island. The former Rag Gulch Water District was consolidated into the Kern-Tulare Water District by Kern LAFCO. The former Vandalia Irrigation District was reorganized into the Vandalia Water District by state legislation.

Citrus Pest Control Districts are established in accordance with the CITRUS PEST CONTROL DISTRICT LAW, Food & Agricultural Code Section 8400 et seq.

Districts are governed by a board of directors of five members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Each director must be a "citizen of the United States and of this State," and an owner of land within the district upon which citrus fruit is grown.

Districts are formed by order of the Board of Supervisors without election.

In addition to its general powers, a Citrus Pest Control District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Food & Agricultural Code.)

- Formulate an effective plan for the control and eradication of citrus pests within the district. (§8557)
- Eradicate, remove or prevent the spread of any and all citrus pests. (§8551[f])
- Remove infected trees. (§§8553, 8554)
- Enter upon any land within the district for the purpose of inspecting and treating the citrus trees and other plant hosts and fruit. (§8550[g])
- Levy and collect an ad valorem tax upon all citrus trees planted or growing in the district. The assessment is upon an acreage basis. (§§8551[d], 8601, 8604)

COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICTS



Community Services Districts are established in accordance with the COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT LAW, Government Code Sections 61000 et seq. and amendments thereto.

Districts are governed by a board of directors of five members elected at large by the voters of the district; each director must be a registered voter residing in the district.

A Community Service District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Government Code.)

- Prescribe and collect rates and charges for the services and facilities furnished by the district (§61621), including water standby and availability charges (§61765).

In addition to its general powers, a Community Services District may exercise any of the following statutory powers prescribed by §61100:

- (a) Supply water of any beneficial uses
- (b) Disposal, collection and treatment of sewage and storm water
- (c) Garbage and refuse collection and disposal
- (d) Fire protection, rescue and ambulance services
- (e)&(f) Public recreation
- (g) Street lighting
- (h) Mosquito abatement and vector control
- (i) Police protection
- (j) Security services
- (k) Library service
- (l) Construction and maintenance of streets
- (m) Conversion of overhead electric and communication facilities to underground installations
- (n) Emergency medical services
- (o) Provide and operate public airports
- (p) Transportation services
- (q) Graffiti abatement
- (r) Flood protection
- (s) Community facilities
- (t) Weed & rubbish abatement
- (u) Hydroelectric power generation and transmission
- (v) Television translator construction, maintenance and operation
- (w) Snow removal
- (x) Animal control
- (y) Pest abatement
- (z) Mailbox construction, maintenance and operation
- (aa) Mail delivery service under contract to the USPS
- (ab) Cemetery services
- (ac) Finance and operation of area planning commissions
- (ad) Finance and operation of municipal advisory councils
- (ae) Habitat mitigation

A district has only those aforementioned powers that are specifically set forth in the petition for formation of the district or which have been added subsequently by majority vote of the electorate.

Legislation (SB 135-Kehoe), effective 1/1/2006, also establishes a definition of “latent powers”:

“those services and facilities authorized by Part 3 (commencing with Section 61100) that the local agency formation commission has determined, pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 56425, that a district did not provide prior to January 1, 2006.” [§61102(h)]

In addition, CSDs must receive approval from LAFCO to activate any of its latent powers:

“If a board of directors desires to exercise a latent power, the district shall first receive the approval of the local agency formation commission, pursuant to Article 1.5 (commencing with Section 56824.10) of Chapter 5 of Part 3 of Division 3.” [§61106(a)]

CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

1

There is one Conservation District in Tulare County; it differs from other special districts because it was created by special legislation. This district is a political subdivision of the State of California originally covering an area of 1,100,000 acres in Fresno, Kings and Tulare Counties. With annexations the district now covers 1,240,000. The entire service area of the Kings River is included within the district. One public agency was needed to safeguard water rights for the entire service area, to contract with the federal government for use of storage space in Pine Flat Reservoir, and to be responsible for hydroelectric power plants on the Kings River.

To facilitate this process, the district was formed by the State Legislature with the passage of the KINGS RIVER CONSERVATION DISTRICT ACT in 1951. The certificate of the Secretary of State incorporating the district gives the following description of the district's powers:

An act creating a district to be called `Kings River Conservation District'; providing for its organization, operation, maintenance and government, for the inclusion of lands therein and the exclusion of lands therefrom; providing for the acquisition, construction, maintenance and operation of works and property for the purposes of the district, including the storage, conservation, distribution and sale of water, the development, distribution and sale of electric power, the drainage reclamation and protection of land and prescribing and defining the powers, duties, purposes and responsibilities of said district.

The administrative structure and method of operation is similar to those of irrigation districts. The district is governed by a board of seven directors elected at-large. Six of the directors represent the six divisions of the District; the seventh director is elected to represent the District as a whole. Directors who represent divisions must be registered voters and residents in their respective divisions; the director-at-large must be a registered voter and reside in any of the six divisions. All registered voters within the District's boundaries are eligible to vote for directors.

They may issue bonds only after the approval of the voters has been obtained at a bond election. They may exclude lands from the district after it has been shown that such lands will not be substantially benefited by remaining within the district. The Department of Water Resources of the State of California is required by the KRCD Act to determine whether or not lands to be excluded from the district are or are not substantially benefited. The directors also may take land into the district after the voters in the area proposed to be annexed have given their approval at an election.

KRCD encompasses parts of Fresno, Kings and Tulare counties. Fresno is the principal county.

Drainage Districts are organized under the provisions of the DRAINAGE DISTRICT ACT of 1903 (not codified). This act provides for the organization and government of districts to drain agricultural lands and to provide for the acquisition and construction of facilities for such drainage of lands within such districts.

The Board of Supervisors can appoint one director, provided that it was requested in the petition of formation; three directors can be elected at large by registered voters within the district. Directors must be registered voters and resident landowners in the district.

In addition to its general powers, the board of directors has the following specific powers provided by statute:

- Provision for payment from the proper funds of all debts and just claims against the district; provide for facilities and right-of-way necessary for drainage; and acquisition, holding, or condemning land or other property necessary to carry out the functions of the district.

- Acquire and maintain ambulances and operate ambulance service (§13853). Establish, maintain and operate first aid services (§13854). Clear or order the clearing of inflammable growths or materials from lands within the district which cause fire hazards (§13867; 13868).
- Adopt and enforce ordinances for the prevention and suppression of fires and for protection of life and property against fire hazards. (§13869)
- Levy and collect a portion of the \$1.00 per \$100.00 assessed value ad valorem tax on property within the district. (§13907)

FLOOD CONTROL DISTRICTS



There is one Flood Control District in Tulare County, created by special legislation. The State Legislature created the district in November 1969, and provided the following powers to the district:

An act to create a flood control district to be called Tulare County Flood Control District; to provide for the control of flood and storm waters and the protection of watercourses, watersheds, harbors, public highways, life and property from damage or destruction from such waters; to authorize the incurring of indebtedness, the issuance and sale of bonds, and the levying and collection of taxes and assessments on property within said district and in the respective zones thereof; to provide for the government, management, and operation of said district and for the acquisition and construction of property and works to carry out the purposes of the district; to define the powers of said district and its officers.

The Act establishes the Board of Supervisors of Tulare County ex-officio as the governing Board of the District. Also, the Board appoints a commission of seven members to which may be delegated any or all of the Board's powers under the Act.

Assessments may be levied against real and personal property within a zone or against real property only within such a zone. A bonding proposal may also be presented to the electorate within a zone as provided in general law.

The Tulare County Flood Control District encompasses the entire County.

In addition to its general powers, a Hospital District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Health and Safety Code)

- Establish, maintain, and operate one or more health facilities or health services within or without the district for the benefit of the district and the people served by the district (§32121[j]).
- Acquire, maintain and operate ambulances or ambulance service within and without the district (§32121[l]).
- Establish a nurses' training school in connection with the hospital (§32124).
- Fix and establish such rates of charge that so far as possible will permit the hospital to be operated on a self-supporting basis. Make and enforce all rules, regulations and bylaws necessary for the administration of the hospital (§32125).

IRRIGATION DISTRICTS



Irrigation Districts are established in accordance with the IRRIGATION DISTRICT LAW, Water Code Section 20500 et seq.

Each district is governed by a board of directors of three or five members elected by the voters within the district. In certain cases, the Board of Supervisors can by resolution appoint three directors for the district, each of whom must be a landowner within the district. Districts that have been formed by reorganizations or consolidations may have seven, nine or eleven directors.

In addition to its general powers, an Irrigation District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Water Code)

- Furnish water in the district for any beneficial use, including fire protection purposes. (§22075; 22077)
- Control, distribute, store, spread, sink, treat, purify, recapture and salvage any water (including but not limited to sewage waters) for the beneficial use of the district or its inhabitants or the owners of rights to waters therein. (§22078)
- Provide any drainage necessary by reason of irrigation provided for by the district (§22095).
- Acquire, lease and operate plants for generation, transmission, distribution and sale of electric power (§22115).
- Provide for, maintain and operate works within or without the district to protect land and property within the district from damage by flood or overflow. (§22160)
- Acquire, construct, maintain and operate facilities for the collection and disposal of sewage subject to approval by a majority of the voters of the district. (§22170; 22176)
- Fix and collect charges for any service furnished by the district including sale of water (with standby charges), connections to new pipelines or extensions of existing pipelines, use of water for groundwater recharge, use of water for power purposes and sale of electric power. (§22280)

There are currently nineteen Irrigation Districts within Tulare County of which six are in multiple counties (Alta, Consolidated, Corcoran, Delano-Earlimart, Hills Valley and Orange Cove). Fresno is the principal county for Consolidated, Hills Valley and Orange Cove, Kings is the principal county for Corcoran and Tulare is the principal county for Alta and Delano-Earlimart.

LEVEE DISTRICTS



Levee Districts can be organized under the LEVEE DISTRICT LAW of 1959 (Water Code section 70000 et seq.) or the PROTECTION DISTRICT ACT of 1880.

Each district shall have a board of three directors elected by the voters within the district, each of whom shall be a registered voter and resident landowner in the district. If a vacancy should occur, the Board of Supervisors can appoint a replacement. In addition to its general powers, a Levee District has the following specific powers as provided by statute:

- Acquire (by purchase, condemnation, gift or other action) drains, canals, sluices, bulklands, watergates, levees, embankments, pumping plants, and pipelines; and purchase, construct or otherwise acquire, maintain and keep in repair all things reasonable or convenient for the protection of the lands of the district from overflow and for the purpose of conserving or adding water to the sloughs and drains in the district. (§70150)
- Cooperate and contract with the U.S. Government, the State of California or any department or agency of either, in order to accomplish any of the purposes of the district. (§70151)

There are two Levee Districts within Tulare County. Both of these districts are currently inactive and do not have a Board of Directors.

Memorial Districts are established under the Military and Veterans Code Sections 1170 through 1259.

Districts are governed by a board of five directors elected by voters within the district.

In addition to its general powers, a Memorial District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Military and Veterans Code)

- Provide and maintain memorial halls, assembly halls, buildings, or meeting places, together with suitable indoor and outdoor park and recreation facilities including swimming pools, picnic areas, and playgrounds for the use of persons or organizations other than veterans pursuant to paragraphs 8 and 9 of this section and veteran soldiers, sailors and marines. [§1191(a)(1)]
- Purchase, receive by donation, condemn, lease or acquire real or personal property necessary or convenient for the construction or maintenance of halls, buildings, meeting places and facilities and improve, preserve, manage and control these facilities. [§1191(a)(2)]
- Enter into a joint powers agreement for recreational or senior citizens' services within the district [§1191(a)(9)]

MOSQUITO ABATEMENT DISTRICTS

1

Mosquito Abatement Districts are established in accordance with the provisions of Statutes 1915, Chapter 584, Section 2000 et seq., Health and Safety Code.

Directors for each district are appointed by the Board of Supervisors and by City Councils of jurisdictions which are provided services by the district.

In addition to its general powers, a Mosquito Abatement District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Health and Safety Code)

- Conduct surveillance programs and other appropriate studies of vectors and vectorborne diseases. [§2040(a)]
- Take any and all necessary or proper actions to prevent the occurrence of, abate or control vectors and vectorborne diseases. [§2040(b)&(c)]

A vector is defined as any animal capable of transmitting the causative agent of human disease or capable of producing human discomfort or injury, including, but not limited to, mosquitoes, flies, mites, ticks, other arthropods and rodents and other vertebrates.

Mosquito abatement and vector control districts are governed by the provisions of Health and Safety Code Section 2000, et seq. Those provisions provide for three potential revenue sources. First, districts are provided the ability to levy a service charge to pay for the cost of vector surveillance and control. The service charge is equivalent to a benefit assessment and may be levied by the districts and collected on the tax rolls in the way other public agencies levy and collect benefit charges or assessments. The service charge is not a tax and, if levied, must be approved by the Board of Trustees of the District in an amount necessary to carry out a vector control and surveillance project or projects and must be related to the benefit or value of the services provided to any provided to any particular parcel. The statutes also give districts the ability to levy a civil penalty as to particular properties or against particular property owners in connection with a nuisance abatement proceeding. Finally, the statutes provide that the districts have the ability to levy or set tax rates. Of course, following the voters' approval of Proposition 13 which added article 13A to the California Constitution the ability of districts to impose a tax or set a tax rate has for all practical purposes been eliminated and the districts' receipt of ad valorem property taxes today is governed by the provisions of AB 8 (Revenue and Taxation Code sections 95, et seq.) as are the ad valorem property tax revenues of all other public agencies which receive ad valorem tax. The districts' Boards of Trustees today have no ability to set tax rates or to collect ad valorem taxes because of the restrictions now contained in California Constitution Article 13 and 13A.

There are currently four Mosquito Abatement Districts within Tulare County of which two are in multiple counties (Kings and Delano). Kings is the principle county for Kings MAD and Kern is the principal county for Delano MAD.

Olive Pest Control Districts are established in accordance with the OLIVE, STONE and POME FRUIT PEST CONTROL DISTRICT LAW, Food & Agricultural Code Section 8760 et seq.

Districts are governed by a board of directors of five members appointed by the Board of Supervisors. Each director must be a "citizen of the United States and of this State," and an owner of land within the district upon which the fruit is grown.

Districts are formed by order of the Board of Supervisors without election.

In addition to its general powers, an Olive Pest Control District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Food & Agricultural Code.)

- Eradicate, remove or prevent the spread of any and all olive, stone or pome fruit pests. (§8766[f])
- Enter into or upon any land included within the boundaries of the district for the purpose of inspecting and treating the olive, stone or pome fruit trees and other plant hosts and fruit growing on them. (§8766[g])
- Perform any and all acts either within or outside the district necessary or proper to fully and completely carry out the purposes for which the district was organized.
- In order to expedite the elimination of the source of the olive fruit fly and the apple maggot, a district may, with the consent of the owner, remove trees that have not been determined to be infested with the olive fruit fly or the apple maggot. (§8767)
- Annually assess real property with 10 or more olive, stone or pome fruit trees at a uniform value per tree. (§8769)

Public Cemetery Districts are established in accordance with the provisions of the Health and Safety Code now set forth in Section 9000 et seq.

Each district is governed by a board of trustees of either three or five members as specified in the petition for formation of the district. The number of trustees may be increased from three to five or reduced from five to three by order of the Board of Supervisors upon petition by a majority of the trustees. Provision is also made for constituting the Board of Supervisors to act as the board of trustees of the district.

The general powers of a Public Cemetery District are considerably less extensive than those of many other special districts. In addition to its limited general powers, the district has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Health and Safety Code)

- Own, operate, improve and maintain cemeteries and provide internment services within its boundaries. [§9040(a)]
- May sell internment rights in its cemeteries, columbariums and mausoleums. [§9050]
- Contract with any county in which the district is located to inter persons for whose internment the county is responsible. [§9062]
- Require that monuments or markers shall be placed at internment plots and may adopt minimum requirements for the permanency of monuments or markets. [§9052(a)&(b)]
- Shall create an endowment care fund. [§9065]

Public Utility Districts are established in accordance with the PUBLIC UTILITY DISTRICT ACT, Public Utilities Code Section 15501 et seq.

Each district is governed by a board of directors of three or five members elected by the voters within the district. When the district lies entirely in one county, three directors are elected at large. This number may be increased to five by majority vote of the voters of the district. A director must be a resident and registered voter of the district.

In addition to its general powers, a Public Utility District has the following specific powers provided by statute: (Numerical references are to sections of the Public Utilities Code)

- Acquire, construct, own, operate, control or use within or without the district, works for supplying its inhabitants with (a) light, (b) water, (c) power, (d) heat, (e) transportation, (f) telephone service or other means of communication and (g) means for the disposition of garbage, sewage or refuse matter. [§16461]
- Acquire, construct, own, complete, use and operate (a) fire department, (b) street lighting system, (c) public parks, public playgrounds, golf courses, public swimming pools, public recreation buildings, (d) buildings to be used for public purposes, and (e) works to provide for drainage of roads and public places. [§16463]
- Fix and collect charges for commodities or services furnished by any revenue producing utility. (§16467)
- Sell or otherwise dispose of outside the district any surplus water, light, heat or power. (§16473)

[§50910]
- Construct, maintain and operate such drains, canals, sluices, bulkheads, water gates, levees, embankments, pumping plants, dams, diversion works, or irrigation works, and all things reasonably necessary or convenient for accomplishing the purposes of the district. [§50932]
- Construct, maintain and operate ferry boats, bridges, road systems and related facilities to provide access to the district's levee, drainage and irrigation systems and to provide access to lands within the district. [§50933]

RESOURCE CONSERVATION DISTRICTS



Resource Conservation Districts are operated under the provisions of the Public Resources Code, Section 9151 et seq. Prior to 1972, these districts were known as Soil Conservation Districts.

Each district is governed by a board of directors of five, seven or nine members elected at large by the voters of the district. The board of directors may, by a resolution presented to the Board of Supervisors of the principal county, request that the Board appoint directors. Each director shall be an owner of land within the district or a designated agent of a landowner within the district. Any agent of a landowner must reside within the district.

In addition to its general powers, a Resource Conservation District has the following specific powers provided by statute; (Numerical references are to sections of the Public Resources Code)

- Make improvements or conduct operations in furtherance of the prevention or control of soil erosion and water conservation and distribution, agricultural enhancement, wildlife enhancement, and erosion stabilization. This may include, but is not limited to, terraces, ditches, levees, dams and, other structures and planting of trees, shrubs, grasses or other vegetation. [§9409]
- Disseminate information relating to soil and water conservation and erosion destabilization and may conduct demonstrational projects. [§9411]
- Develop district-wide comprehensive plans for soil and water conservation, improvement of farm irrigation and land drainage, erosion control and flood prevention and community watersheds within the district. [§9413]
- Engage in activities designed to promote a knowledge of the principles of soil and water conservation. [§9419]

There are currently five Resource Conservation Districts within Tulare County of which four are located in multiple counties (Excelsior/Kings River, Kern Valley, Sierra and Tulare Lake). Fresno is the principal county for Sierra, Kings is the principal county for Excelsior/Kings River and Tulare Lake and Kern is the principal county for Kern Valley.

- Acquire, plan, construct, reconstruct, alter, enlarge, lay, renew, replace, maintain, and operate garbage dumpsites and garbage collection and disposal systems, sewers, drains, septic tanks and sewerage collection, outfall, treatment works and other sanitary disposal systems and water recycling and distribution systems. [§6512(a)]

WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICTS

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Water Conservation Districts are established under provisions of the WATER CONSERVATION DISTRICT ACT of 1927 (not codified), described as follows:

An Act to provide for the organization and government of water conservation districts for the purpose of conserving and storing the waters of any stream of water or unnavigable river by spreading and sinking such waters, and, for that purpose, to construct or acquire spreading basins, sinking wells and sinking basins and other works and property; and for the purpose of appropriating, acquiring and conserving water and water rights, and taking any and all actions and proceedings that may be necessary or advisable to conserve and protect the water or water rights within the district used or useful for any purpose of the district, or of common benefit to the lands situated therein, and to prevent interference with or diminution of the natural flow of any stream or unnavigable river, including the natural subterranean supply of waters therefrom; to provide for the levying and collecting of taxes and special assessments to pay the costs and expenses incurred in relation thereto; to prohibit any director of a district from being interested in any contract with the district of which he is a director and making a violation of such provision a misdemeanor; and to provide a method of dissolving such districts.

The district is governed by a board of seven directors elected by the voters of the district.

In addition to its general powers, a water conservation district has the following specific powers:

- Make and perform any agreement with the United States, under the federal reclamation laws or otherwise, to the extent that it is not inconsistent with any state law applicable to the district, or with any state, county, district of any kind or zone or subdivision of such district, public corporation, any person or any number of them.
- Cooperate to obtain rights, permits or licenses to appropriate water, and to purchase, acquire, sell, lease, or otherwise transfer or dispose of such rights, permits or licenses in accordance with such agreement.
- Acquire, store and distribute a surface water supply for purposes of irrigation, seasonal storage, or underground replenishment, or for any or all such purposes.
- Provide for the construction, operation, or maintenance of such works, facilities or operations within or without the district boundaries as the board deems necessary to protect the land in or property of the district, from damage by flood or overflow, to replenish underground water, or to store, supply or distribute surface waters to lands within the district, and to contribute to the cost or expense thereof out of its general fund or any special fund provided therefore.

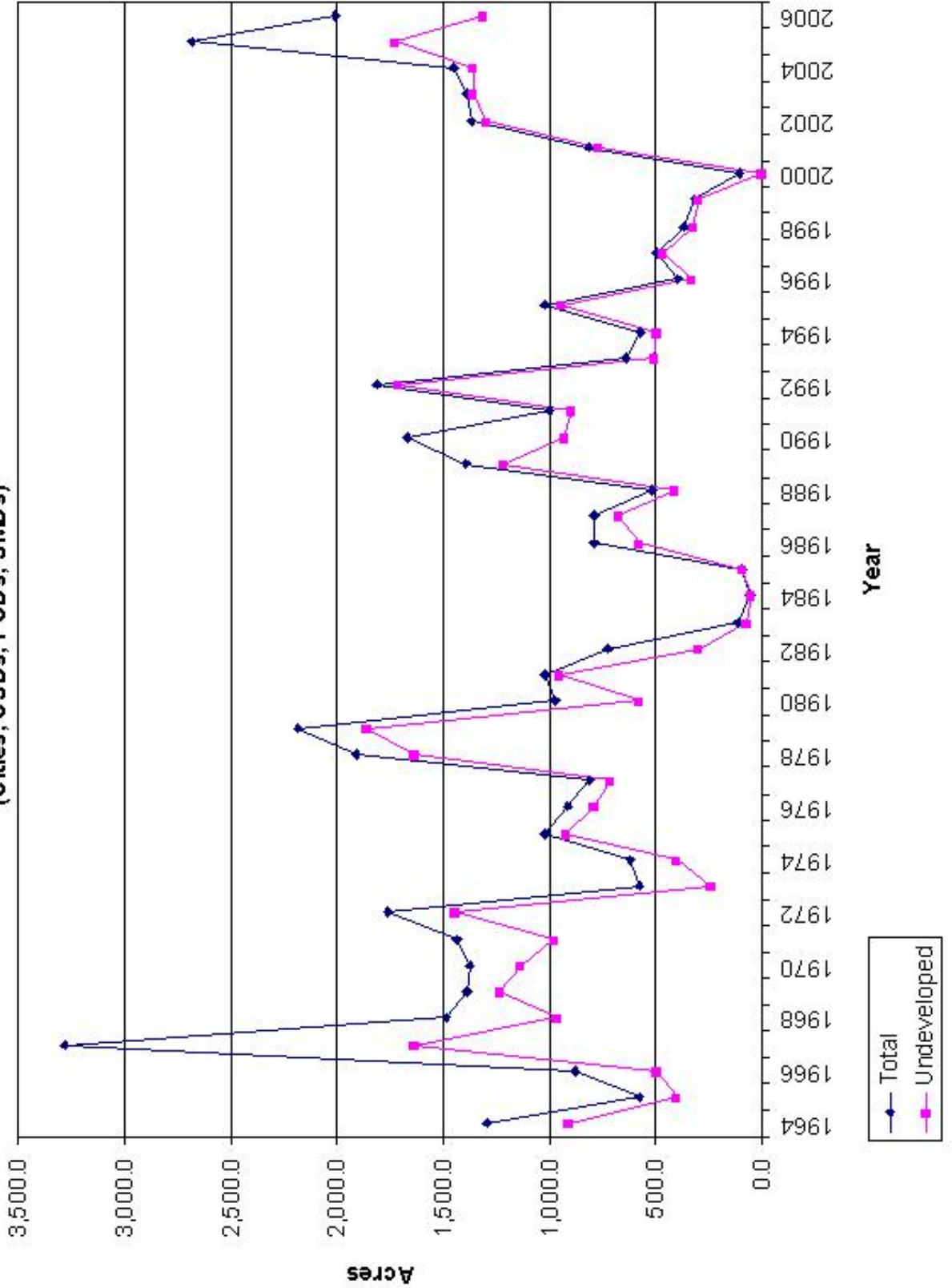
